AFFIDAVIT OF GREGORY J. REGER PUBLIC STAFF – NORTH CAROLINA UTILITIES COMMISSION

I, Gregory J. Reger, being first duly sworn do depose and say:

I am a Public Utilities Regulatory Analyst with the Economic Research Division of the Public Staff of the North Carolina Utilities Commission (Public Staff), which represents the using and consuming public.

I received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business, a Minor in Mathematics from Lake Forest College in 2008, and a Master of Public Administration degree from Syracuse University in 2012. Prior to joining the Public Staff in December of 2023, I held data analytics, budget and performance management, and process improvement roles at the local and federal government level for 10 years, I was awarded a one-year local government management fellowship with the City of Hamilton, Ohio Electric Department, and I was a Contractor Operations Specialist/Assessor & Final Inspector for two years in the Weatherization

Department of a nonprofit in Chicago. Since joining the Public Staff, I have conducted rate of return studies in water and wastewater utility rate cases and have been involved in the investigation and analysis of electric utilities' proposed avoided cost rates and integrated resource plans.

The purpose of my affidavit is to make a recommendation to the North Carolina Utilities Commission (Commission) regarding the fair rate of return to be employed as a basis for determining the appropriate revenue requirement for JPC Utilities, LLC (JPC), to provide water and sewer utility service in all its service areas in Guilford County, North Carolina.

I recommend that JPC be granted a 7.00% margin on expenses for the water utility service and a 7.00% margin on expenses for the sewer utility service. The reasonableness of this recommended margin is supported by the allowed overall rates of return approved by the Commission in recent cases involving large water and sewer utility companies. As allowed under N.C. Gen. Stat § 62-133.1, I have used the operating ratio method to evaluate JPC's proposed rate increase. After investigation, the Public Staff has determined that the Company's rate base is less than the reasonable level of operating expenses.

As outlined in the Hearing Examiner's Order in Docket No. W-173, Sub 14, regarding the rate increase application of Montclair Water Company, several factors should be considered when judging the adequacy of a return. These are interest coverage, adequacy of the income level after interest expense, the level of inflation, and the quality of service. In considering these factors in conjunction

with this proceeding, I have not incorporated any consideration with respect to quality of service. Interest coverage has been provided at an adequate level. The level of inflation has been factored into the interest rate on bonds that reflect investor expectations of the future levels of inflation. In my opinion, the recommended operating margin provides an adequate level of income after interest expense.

For these reasons, I recommend to the Commission that JPC be granted a 7.00% margin on expenses.

This concludes my affidavit.
