I'm a first year law student at UNC and North Carolina native, and I'm writing you to declare my support for keeping the current net-metering rules in place. The solar development industry in North Carolina is key to bringing new jobs to urban and rural areas, it's a revenue generator for the state, and it is an important way to reduce air and water pollution. Along with utility-scale projects, rooftop solar is an important part of the equation. Under the current regulatory regime, families can install solar panels on their homes and actually save a fair amount on their power bills. This is, in large part, because they are able to sell the power they produce but don't use to other customers nearby.

It's my understanding that Duke wants to lower the rate they pay net-metering customers from the retail price to their own cost of producing energy. This would be unfair because it gives them all of the profit from the rooftop solar energy that they didn't produce. While it is true that the solar power that isn't used on-site needs to be transmitted via the grid, it doesn't need to go far. For the use of transmission lines to get excess solar generated power from one neighbor to another, Duke power wants to keep all of the profit as if they did all the work to create the power themselves.

The true reason that utilities want to change net-metering policies is to make rooftop solar unappealing. The reality is that the more people start generating their own power, the less they will need to buy. Rooftop solar is unwanted competition in an industry that is used to having only one player.
