BY THE CHAIRMAN: On October 29, 2009, the Commission issued a Request for Proposals for the North Carolina Renewable Energy Tracking System (NC-RETS). Subsequently, the Commission selected APX Inc. (APX), as the vendor to develop and administer NC-RETS.

The Commission's Agreement with APX provides that no revenue will be collected from NC-RETS users, including North Carolina electric power suppliers, until NC-RETS has performed for two consecutive months in substantial conformance with the requirements of the Agreement. Because NC-RETS commenced operations on July 1, 2010, APX could commence collecting fees as soon as September 1, 2010. In order for APX to begin invoicing electric power suppliers, those suppliers, or their utility compliance aggregators, must have established accounts in NC-RETS. Therefore, in order to effectuate the terms of the Commission's Agreement with the NC-RETS administrator, APX, the Commission will order each electric power supplier, either directly or via their utility compliance aggregator, to establish an account in NC-RETS within 30 days of this Order. Electric power suppliers may contact APX at 888-378-4461 for assistance if necessary.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
