On February 6, 2020, the North Carolina Utilities Commission ("Commission") issued its Order Granting Motion To Consolidate Annual Analysis Into Commission Rule R25-6 Annual Report in Docket Nos. E-2, Sub 1142, E-7, Sub 1146 and M-100, Sub 154 which authorized Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC ("DEC") and Duke Energy Progress, LLC ("DEP," and collectively, "Duke Energy") to consolidate the filing of the Coal Combustion Residuals Rule (CCR) and North Carolina's Coal Ash Management Act (CAMA) spending information required by the Commission's November 9, 2018 Order Requesting Additional Information in Docket Nos. E-2, Sub 1142, E-7, Sub 1146 and M-100, Sub 154 ("Additional Information Order") into Duke Energy's Hire North Carolina Annual Report filed pursuant to Commission Rule R25-6. This consolidated report includes two separate sections addressing each reporting requirement.

Hire North Carolina

Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC and Duke Energy Progress, LLC (Duke Energy) and Piedmont Natural Gas Company, Inc. (Duke Energy) are committed to supporting and working with North Carolina based companies and contractors to promote economic development within the state. The Hire North Carolina rule (Rule R25-1) has further assisted Duke Energy in supporting job creation and investment with suppliers, vendors, and contractors who, like many of our team members, call North Carolina home. The Hire North Carolina rule, created by the North Carolina Utilities Commission, established an annual filing to be submitted by

March 1 of each year to address compliance with the rule for the preceding calendar year. This report will detail Duke Energy's efforts to comply with Rule R25-1 from January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023.

A. Copy of the most recent Hire North Carolina List

Duke Energy has developed a Hire North Carolina list of qualified local contractors to expand the local contracting source pool within the state. To be added to the Hire North Carolina list, contractors must be domiciled within the state of North Carolina and apply through Wood Mackenzie (Duke Energy's supplier management system) with certain required information. The application is reviewed and, if approved by Duke Energy, the contractor is added to the Hire North Carolina list. As of January 3, 2024, there were 187 approved North Carolina based contractors on the Hire North Carolina list (21 contractors were added in 2023). Qualified contractors from the Hire North Carolina list are encouraged to be considered and selected when Duke Energy solicits bids for Hire North Carolina projects (taking place in North Carolina, over \$700,000, for construction, extension or repair of facilities and non-

outage work). Hire North Carolina projects span several business units, including Generation, Transmission and Distribution, Coal Combustion Products (CCP) and Gas. The Hire North Carolina list is also provided to all bidding prime contractors to consider for potential subcontract opportunities for Hire North Carolina projects. The most recent version of the Hire North Carolina list is attached as *Exhibit A*.

B. <u>Listing of student outreach event opportunities afforded by the utility</u>

Duke Energy's Talent Acquisition and Workforce Development teams participated in more than 45 events at North Carolina universities and technical schools in 2023. These events were intended to communicate opportunities in the energy and utility sector, build our brand on campus and support our recruiting efforts for interns, co-ops, and entry-level talent. C. Total number of contracts subject to R25-1

From January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023, Duke Energy initiated 99 projects that meet the Hire North Carolina criteria (taking place in North Carolina, over \$700,000, for construction, extension or repair of facilities and non-outage work). Hire North Carolina projects span several business units, including Generation, Transmission and Distribution, Coal Combustion Products (CCP) and Gas. Of the 99 Hire North Carolina project bid events

initiated by Duke Energy from January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023, 59 have been awarded.

D. A breakdown of how many of those contracts were awarded to resident contractors, including women- and/or minority-owned businesses, and how many to nonresident contractors

Fifty-nine Hire North Carolina contracts have been awarded from January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023. Of the 59 Hire North Carolina contracts awarded, 15 (totaling approximately \$90 million) have been awarded to resident contractors on Duke Energy's Hire North Carolina list. 3 of the 15 contracts were awarded to companies that identified as woman-, minority- or veteran-owned. 44 of the 59 Hire North Carolina contracts were awarded to nonresident contractors.

F. Summary of outreach efforts undertaken, including perceived impact of such efforts

Duke Energy's Supply Chain and Corporate Communications groups conducted various outreach efforts, including direct communications with North Carolina-based contractors and though external and media channels. CCR and CAMA Additional Information

Duke Energy has a strong history of supporting diversity and economic development with diverse and local suppliers. For Duke Energy, as an enterprise, our 2022 spend with diverse suppliers was more than \$1.8 billion. For eight consecutive years our total diverse spend has exceeded \$1 billion. We are expected to exceed \$1 billion in annual spend with diverse suppliers again for 2023.

The Supplier Engagement & Diversity team led the Duke Energy outreach efforts that helped lead to our success by engaging with national, regional, and local community economic

development organizations that support local and diverse businesses. An integral part of the supplier recruitment efforts of Duke Energy is identifying suppliers through outreach activities. The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic continued to present some engagement challenges while also offering opportunities. Many organizations reintroduced in-person events, while others continued to offer activities via virtual mediums. Minority suppliers from North Carolina (and elsewhere) had numerous opportunities to interact with Duke Energy at

With an enhanced focus on the inclusion of more local and/or diverse suppliers to support the specialized Coal Combustion Products ("CCP") work directly or through subcontracting, Duke Energy did the following:

events throughout the reporting period.

- a) Co-sponsored the 19th Annual Energizing Powerful Connections ("EPC") conference along with five other southeastern energy companies. It was presented October 17 19, 2022, and hosted by TVA. The event featured diverse suppliers that are working with at least one of the EPC utilities and have the capacity to support more. In addition to diverse suppliers, supplier diversity, sourcing, business unit representatives and prime partners participate to share information, identify priorities and discuss strategies to achieve equity and economic empowerment for diverse businesses.
- b) Continued to support the National Minority Supplier Development Council ("NMSDC") as a national corporate member. The organization's mission is to support the development of U.S. minority-owned businesses and advocate on their behalf with corporations and government entities. NMSDC's network includes more than 15,000 certified minority owned businesses. Duke Energy participated in the annual Conference and Business Opportunity Exchange held, October 30 November 2, 2022, in New Orleans, LA with a virtual option. Nationally recognized speakers joined

- in celebrating NMSDC's 50th Anniversary while delivering key messages, other offerings included a tradeshow, matchmaking, and educational workshops.
- c) Attended the Women's Business Enterprise National Council's ("WBENC") Annual Conference, March 20 23, 2023, in Nashville, TN. The event offered a tradeshow, one-on-one meetings, educational seminars, etc., all provided opportunities to learn more about the potential suppliers. WBENC is largest third-party certifier of businesses owned, controlled, and operated by women in the United States. Our membership entitles us to numerous benefits, e.g., access to more than 18,000 certified women business enterprises, assistance with the expansion of our supplier diversity program, and special opportunities to participate in WBENC national events.
- d) Participated in the 39th Annual Edison Electric Institute (EEI) Business Diversity Conference, May 16 19, 2023. For nearly four decades, members of the electric power industry have connected with diverse suppliers through EEI programming. Approximately 400 attendees from across the United States, representing electric companies, diverse suppliers, primes, and supplier diversity advocacy organizations engaged in public policy discussions and how the policies impact energy operations including supplier diversity programs and business opportunities for suppliers. One of the most popular segments of the conference is the matchmaking when diverse suppliers meet one-on-one with energy companies.
- e) Presented the third Duke Energy Supplier Diversity University ("SDU"), an educational event focused on enhancing existing diverse supplier relationships and developing in new ones. Held on July 20, 2023, at Duke Energy headquarters in Charlotte, safety, risk, and cybersecurity were among the topics discussed and we hosted nearly one hundred participants. During the morning session information on

how Duke Energy makes purchases and available supplier resources was shared, and ongoing and upcoming projects and contracting opportunities were highlighted, including our Clean Energy Transformation, as the suppliers learned about what was on the horizon. Introductory meetings with the diverse suppliers and non-diverse Tier I suppliers, supply chain, and business units were held during the afternoon to allow all parties to enhance their knowledge about each other. SDU was strategically planned to enable meaningful engagement.

f) Hosted our Sixth Supplier Exchange Forum on September 13, 2023, and more than 120 supplier and Duke Energy representatives attended the event held at the Harvey B. Gantt Center for African-American Arts + Culture, Charlotte, NC. The venue was a great setting for the valuable networking opportunity for suppliers and Duke Energy's leadership during which highlights of our transformation strategy were presented, and we recognized a prime supplier, a diverse supplier, and supplier with an exceptional safety history. For the first time, we also presented a Supplier Diversity Advocate of the Year Award. We value our professional relationships with suppliers that share our commitment to supplier diversity, environmental stewardship, local sourcing, and safety, the event helps us strengthen relationships among the attendees.

Quanta Services was our Corporate Responsibility Supplier of the Year.

Quanta consistently performs to the highest safety, quality and sustainability standards and maintains an intentional focus on doing business with diverse suppliers.

The Diverse Supplier of the Year award was presented to MasTec Inc. Duke Energy's business with the Hispanic-owned infrastructure services company has grown significantly over the last several years, now spanning across most business units and reflective of their exceptional service.

The SEFA Group was the Safety Supplier of The Year, the company performed roughly 184,000 hours of ash handling and disposal and waste removal services for Duke Energy with zero OSHA recordable injuries – helping both protect local communities and ensure employee safety.

Local Economic Impact


The Economic Impact of the Coal Combustion Products ("CCP") NC spend is shown on the graphical illustrations on page 16. Note this is primarily based on NC remit address or NC headquartered companies and represents CCP NC spend with local NC suppliers from 2022 Q4 through 2023 Q3. The CCP direct spend with DEC NC contractors for the period identified is \$48.8M, and the CCP direct spend with DEP NC contractors is \$53.4M. This spend supports local employment, and provides direct, indirect, and induced value added. The economic impact was estimated in collaboration with Dr. Jesse Daystar, Assistant Adjunct Professor at the Nicholas School of the Environment, Duke University using IMPLAN, an industry-standard economic impact modeling tool, with data supplied by Wood Mackenzie, an energy intelligence company offering spend intelligence.

Direct impacts: The impact that is created in the industries in which a purchase is made. (The vendors Duke Energy directly does business with)


Indirect impacts: The impacts created by the supply chain required to create the original product or service. (The supply chain of Duke Energy's vendors)

Induced Impacts: The impacts created by employees spending wages on food, entertainment, and other activities not related to the industry under study.

Employment: The total annual average jobs. This includes self-employed, wage and salary, full-time, part-time, and seasonal jobs.

Labor Income: The total value paid to local workers within a region. It is the income source for induced household spending estimations.

Value Added: The industries value of production over the cost of its purchasing its goods and services required to make its products. It's the sum of employee wages, other property type income (corporate profits, interest income, rental payments), and indirect business taxes (sales tax, excise tax, property tax, fines, licenses). Value added does not account for monies spent purchasing goods and services to create an industries production. It can also be defined as the Gross Regional Product (GRP), the regional expression of Gross Domestic Product (GDP).

Regarding the CCP support of NC local suppliers, Duke Energy prepared tables of the top North Carolina contractors supporting CCP work for DEC and DEP. Note that these are firms with headquarters or remit payment to address located in North Carolina and the table does not include non-headquartered contractors (*though they may have local offices in NC*) actively performing work in NC. 
A conservative estimate of NC residents employed as the result of CCP work is 2,035 (505 + 571 + 959), which includes the NC Economic Impact numbers (505 + 571). We also received input from 11 companies (see page 19) performing CCP work in NC that were not represented in the NC Local Economic Impact study (non-NC headquartered). These companies, during the 2022 Q4 through 2023 Q3 timeframe, have employed 959 NC residents, of which 316 NC residents are diverse. The total new hires of NC residents during the 2022 Q4 through 2023 Q3 period is 372 NC residents for these non-NC headquartered companies. A breakdown of the demographics of the 316 diverse residents by these non-NC headquartered companies is shown below:

What Is Hire North Carolina?

To help further encourage and measure utility utilization of North Carolina resident contractors, including women- and minority-owned businesses, the North Carolina Utilities Commission has implemented the Hire North Carolina rule.

The intention of the rule is to promote economic development, create jobs, and improve the communities served by Duke Energy by maximizing the use of resident contractors for utility projects undertaken in the state of North Carolina. Duke Energy strives to help improve the vitality of our communities by consistently considering the corporate responsibility components of supplier diversity, local impact and environmental stewardship as part of our sourcing process.

Hire North Carolina Contractor List

To encourage the participation of resident contractors as prime contractors and subcontractors, Duke Energy is developing and maintaining a Hire North Carolina list. This list will consist of resident contractors, including women- and minority-owned businesses, determined to be qualified in order to expand the local contracting source pool within the state of North Carolina.

For all applicable projects, no contract shall be awarded to any prime contractor without Duke Energy first providing the Hire North Carolina list for consideration of awarding subcontracts arising out of the prime contract.

Resident Contractors

A resident contractor is defined as a contractor or subcontractor who has their primary business in the state of North Carolina. If a contractor meets these qualifications, they are encouraged to register for the Hire North Carolina list in order to be considered for Hire North Carolina projects and contracts.

Applicability

The Hire North Carolina rule covers contracts for construction, extension and/or repair of facilities or other utility projects that meet the following:

- Located in North Carolina
- In excess of \$700,000
- Excluding materials
- Excluding planned or unplanned outage work
