I am writing to you regarding the expansion of the Smart \$aver Energy Efficiency incentive program that is currently under review by the Commission.

The Town of Chapel Hill, through grants from the Southeast Energy Efficiency Alliance and the Department of Energy, has created the Chapel Hill WISE Homes and Buildings Program to facilitate home energy improvements by offering a range of incentives to its residents. Recently, WISE (worthwhile investments save energy) successfully partnered with Duke Energy to offer a 100 home pilot incentive focused on attic insulation, air sealing, duct sealing and duct insulation. This incentive helped to increase participation in the program that resulted in a greater than 50% conversation rate from energy assessment to home improvement, and ultimately made the Town eligible for additional funding to retrofit more homes within the community.

Through our targeted marketing, outreach and highly qualified contractor network, demand for home-performance contracting is on the rise. Direct support from the utilities, through incentives or other financial assistance, allows for the type of market transformation that will eventually make energy assessments and upgrades as common as home inspections. To that end, programs like ours need continued utility support to maintain this positive momentum.

The incentives to date have provided the opportunity for small, local contracting companies in our area to maintain jobs and even expand at a time when the pace of construction has slowed. In order for these companies to continue to grow and thrive, there is a need for additional market demand driven by sustained incentive programs like Duke's Smart Saver. With your help, North Carolina can soon rival the green jobs and energy saving regions of the northeast and western United States. It is for all of the reasons listed above that we urge expeditious review and approval of the major thrusts of the Duke proposal for the Smart Saver Energy Efficiency program.
