ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME

BY THE CHAIRMAN: On October 5, 2018, the Commission issued an Order Addressing the Impacts of the Federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act on Public Utilities (Tax Act Order) in Docket No. M-100, Sub 148. In Ordering Paragraph No. 4 of the Tax Act Order, the Commission directed Dominion Energy North Carolina (DENC), and other companies, to file proposals in company-specific dockets to adjust their rates to reflect the reduction in the federal corporate income tax rate for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2017, as outlined in the Federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (Tax Act). In Ordering Paragraph No. 11 of the Tax Act Order, the Commission directed the Public Staff to work with DENC to determine the impact, if any, to DENC's State Tax Rider EDIT due to the Tax Act, and to file a recommendation on how the Commission should address the decrease in the federal corporate income tax rate on DENC's State Tax Rider EDIT by no later than Friday, November 2, 2018.

On October 26, 2018, DENC made a filing in Docket No. E-22, Sub 560 to comply with Ordering Paragraph No. 4 of the Tax Act Order. In that filing, DENC also included its proposal to address its State Tax Rider EDIT.

On November 2, 2018, the Public Staff filed a motion requesting that the Commission extend the time for the Public Staff to file its recommendation on DENC's State Tax Rider EDIT to November 14, 2018. In support of its motion, the Public Staff states that the Public Staff and DENC have been discussing DENC's proposal, but the Public Staff needs additional time to determine the impact of the Tax Act on DENC's State Tax Rider EDIT; and to prepare its recommendation. Further, the Public Staff states that DENC has no objection to its request for an extension of time.
