VOTE SOLAR'S PETITION TO INTERVENE AND NOTICE OF INTENT TO PARTICIPATE IN CONFERENCE

Vote Solar, pursuant to Rule R1-19, Rules of the North Carolina Utilities Commission, petitions to intervene in the instant docket and notices its intent to participate in the related technical conference. In support of this petition and notice, Vote Solar states:

1. Vote Solar is a non-profit, grassroots organization, established in 2002, that

works to foster economic opportunity, promote energy independence for consumers, and address environmental concerns by making solar generation and other distributed energy resources accessible and cost-effective. Vote Solar achieves its objectives by advocating at the local, state, and federal levels to remove regulatory barriers and implement policies and programs to bring solar to scale.

2. Vote Solar has over 110,000 members, nationally, including members that receive electrical service from Duke Energy Progress, LLC ("DEP") (and Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC).

3. Vote Solar focuses in state regulatory proceedings on rate design and public policy issues related to consumer access to distributed energy resources. Vote Solar has actively participated in utility commission proceedings across the country involving net metering, interconnection, rate design, and resource procurement, including in: Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Minnesota,

Nevada, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, Utah, Vermont, and Wisconsin.

4. On information and believe, the North Carolina Utilities Commission ("NCUC" or "Commission") has permitted Vote Solar to intervene in at least ten dockets since 2018. Vote Solar has also participated and provided feedback in the North Carolina utility stakeholder engagement process on matters germane to net metering, rate design, and integrated resource and distribution planning, among other things.

5. Vote Solar's interest in the instant proceeding is to harness this breadth of knowledge and experience while advocating for policies that utilize solar generation and distributed energy sources, broadly, to effectively manage electricity costs for consumers.

6. If permitted to intervene, Vote Solar expects to offer evidence on, among other things, performance-based regulation ("PBR"), generally, and in particular on the efficacy of PBR as it pertains to DEP's projected transmission and distribution projects and its potential impacts on DEP ratepayers, including Vote Solar's members. Vote Solar, thus, moves to intervene so it can participate fully in the instant docket.

7. Vote Solar further notifies NCUC and the parties of its intent to participate in the technical conference, as provide by the Commission's *Order Scheduling Technical Conference and Setting Procedures for Technical Conference* entered in this docket on June 15, 2022.
