(Aqua); and Carolina Natural Gas Service Company (SNC) (collectively, the Utility Parties). All North Carolina electric, natural gas, and wastewater utilities were served with the

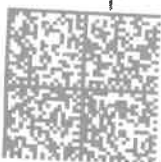
