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Comment to Chairman Finley and the NC Utility Commissioners:

I write to you as a citizen from Western NC on what I believe is an urgent matter—that the electric utility industry not be allowed to continue to prioritize decentralization. Duke's centralized, monopolistic energy system already threatens the advancement of solar development according to the REPS bill passed by the 2007 NC Senate. I should disclose my studied and intense conviction: that solar energy should be put at the top as the 'way' toward meeting that responsibility.

My message to you is that *any* Duke-Piedmont merger will be a clear and systematic move toward maintaining and expanding Duke's centralized energy monopoly and I write to urge that the NCUC vote '*Against*' the merger. Duke Energy most likely has initiated this merger to significantly expand its natural gas-powered generation—not only in North, but also in South Carolina. I read that they have plans to construct 15 more power plants (about one every 8 months) over the next 10 years. Will not these plans totally renege any responsibility of Duke Energy toward the worsening environmental disaster in this state country and across the world—that daily becomes more evident?

I urge The NC Utilities Commission not to promote Duke's destructive and irresponsible business plan to enlarge by this request for merger with Piedmont.
