BY THE COMMISSION: Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.2, the Commission is required to conduct annual fuel charge adjustment proceedings for electric utilities engaged in the generation or production of electricity by fossil or nuclear fuels. Commission Rule R8-55 provides that the fuel charge adjustment proceeding for Virginia Electric and Power Company, d/b/a Dominion Energy North Carolina (DENC), will be held the third Tuesday of November each year and that DENC shall file its direct testimony and exhibits and shall publish notice prior to the hearing.

On August 15, 2023, DENC filed an application in the above-captioned docket which requests that the Commission approve the proposed total fuel factor of 4.5609 ¢/kWh to be allocated based on voltage differentiated adjustments, including the base fuel factor, Rider A, EMF Rider B, and EMF Rider B-1. DENC proposes that the total fuel rate for each class be set as follows, effective February 1, 2024:

Residential	4.6082 ¢/kWh
SGS & PA	4.6038 ¢/kWh
LGS	4.5713 ¢/kWh
Schedule NS	4.4299 ¢/kWh
6VP	4.4937 ¢/kWh
Outdoor Lighting	4.6082 ¢/kWh
Traffic	4.6082 ¢/kWh

The Commission concludes that there is good cause to schedule a hearing on the application. The guidelines regarding discovery in this docket, subject to modification for good cause shown, are as follows:

1. Any deposition which a party desires to take shall be taken before the deadline for filing of Public Staff and intervenor testimony. Notice of deposition shall be served on all parties at least seven days prior to the taking of the deposition. Notice of

deposition and all other discovery notices, requests and motions shall be served on the appropriate parties by hand delivery or facsimile, or by electronic delivery if the receiving party has agreed to receipt by electronic delivery.

- 2. Any motion for subpoena of a witness to appear at the evidentiary hearing shall be filed with the Commission before the deadline for filing of Public Staff and intervenor testimony, shall be served by hand delivery or facsimile to the person sought to be subpoenaed at or before the time of filing with the Commission, and shall make a reasonable showing that the evidence of such person will be material and relevant to an issue in the proceeding. See N.C.G.S. § 62-62. Unless an objection is filed, the Chief Clerk shall issue the requested subpoena 24 hours after such motion is filed.
- 3. Formal discovery requests related to the application and the DENC's prefiled direct testimony shall be served on the DENC not later than 14 calendar days prior to the deadline for filing of Public Staff and intervenor testimony. The party served shall have up to 10 calendar days to file with the Commission objections to the discovery requests on an item-by-item basis, but in no event shall objections be filed later than 10 calendar days prior to the deadline for filing of Public Staff and intervenor testimony.
- 4. Formal discovery requests related to the prefiled direct testimony of the Public Staff or intervenors shall be served not later than 5 calendar days after such testimony is filed. The party served shall have up to 3 business days to file with the Commission objections to the discovery requests on an item-by-item basis, but in no event shall objections be filed later than 9 calendar days after that party's testimony was filed.
- 5. Formal discovery requests related to the DENC's prefiled rebuttal testimony shall be served on the DENC not later than 3 business days after such testimony is filed. The party served shall have up to 3 business days to file with the Commission objections to the discovery requests on an item-by-item basis, but in no event shall objections be filed later than 3 business days after the rebuttal testimony was filed. Discovery related to rebuttal testimony shall be limited to new material introduced in such rebuttal testimony and will be carefully scrutinized upon objection that such discovery should have been sought during the initial period of discovery from the DENC.
- 6. Discovery requests need not be filed with the Commission when served; however, any party filing objections shall attach a copy of the relevant discovery request to the objections. Each discovery request, or part thereof, to which no objection is filed shall be answered by the time objections are due, subject to other agreement of the affected parties or other order of the Commission. Upon the filing of objections, the party seeking discovery shall have two calendar days to file a motion to compel with the Commission, and the party objecting to discovery shall have one calendar day thereafter to file a response. All objections, motions to compel, and responses shall be served on the other affected party at or before the time of filing with the Commission.
- 7. A party shall not be granted an extension of time to pursue discovery because of that party's late intervention or other delay in initiating discovery.

The Commission recognizes that in the past most discovery has been conducted in an informal manner without the need for Commission involvement or enforcement, and that such has been generally successful. The above guidelines are without prejudice to the parties conducting informal discovery or exchanging information by agreement at any time with the understanding that such will not be enforceable by the Commission if outside the guidelines.

Further, the Commission finds good cause to require DENC and all other parties who file exhibits and workpapers that include tables of numbers and calculations to provide the Commission Staff, the Public Staff, and any other party upon request from such party an electronic version of all such exhibits and workpapers, with formulas intact.

Finally, the Commission finds good cause to put all interested persons on notice that attorneys and witnesses will be expected to attend and participate in person rather than by remote means.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That a public hearing shall be, and is hereby, scheduled to begin immediately following the hearing in Docket No. E-22, Sub 674 which is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, November 21, 2023, at 9:00 a.m., in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina, for the purpose of considering the annual fuel and fuel-related cost recovery proceeding for DENC;
- 2. That any person having an interest in this proceeding may file a petition to intervene stating such interest on or before Tuesday, October 31, 2023;
- 3. That the direct testimony and exhibits of the Public Staff and other intervenors shall be filed on or before Tuesday, October 31, 2023;
- 4. That DENC may file rebuttal testimony and exhibits on or before Thursday, November 9, 2023;
- 5. That DENC and all other parties who file exhibits and workpapers that include tables of numbers and calculations shall provide the Commission Staff, the Public Staff, and any other party upon request from such party an electronic version of all such exhibits and workpapers, with formulas intact;
- 6. That DENC shall publish the Notice attached hereto as Appendix A in a newspaper or newspapers having general circulation in its service area once a week for two successive weeks beginning at least 35 days prior to the hearing;
- 7. That DENC shall file affidavits of publication on or before the date of the hearing; and

8. That the parties shall comply with the discovery guidelines established herein.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the North Carolina Utilities Commission has scheduled a public hearing in the annual fuel charge adjustment cost recovery proceeding for Virginia Electric and Power Company, d/b/a Dominion Energy North Carolina (DENC). The public hearing has been scheduled to begin immediately following the hearing in Docket No. E-22, Subs 674 which is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, November 21, 2023, at 9:00 a.m., in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. This proceeding is being held pursuant to the provisions of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.2 and Commission Rule R8-55 for the purpose of determining whether an increment or decrement rider is required to allow DENC to recover all reasonable and prudently incurred fuel and fuel related costs. Public witness testimony will be received in accordance with Commission Rule R1-21(g).

On August 15, 2023, DENC filed its application for approval of its fuel and fuel-related cost recovery pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-133.2 and Commission Rule R8-55. By its application, DENC requests that the Commission approve the proposed total fuel factor of $4.5609~\phi/kWh$ to be allocated based on voltage differentiated adjustments, including the base fuel factor, Rider A, EMF Rider B, and EMF Rider B-1. DENC proposes that the total fuel rate for each class be set as follows, effective February 1, 2024:

Customer Class	Total
Residential	4.6082 ¢/kWh
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Outdoor Lighting	4.6082 ¢/kWh
Traffic	4.6082 ¢/kWh

Compared to the current fuel rates, the result of DENC's request would be a decrease of 0.1106 cents per kWh for residential customers, which would decrease the monthly bill of a residential customer using 1,000 kWh of electricity by \$1.106. Small general service and public authority customers would see a fuel rate decrease of 0.1087 cents per kWh, and large general service customers would see a fuel rate decrease of 0.1067 cents per kWh.

Specific information may be obtained from the Office of the Chief Clerk, North Carolina Utilities Commission, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina, where a copy of DENC's application is available for review by the public, and on the Commission's website at www.ncuc.net.

The Public Staff is authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements to the Public Staff should include any information that the writers wish to be considered by the Public Staff in its investigation of the matter. The Attorney General is also authorized by statute to represent consumers in proceedings before the Commission. Written statements are not evidence unless the persons appear at a public hearing and testify concerning the information contained in their written statements.

Any person desiring to intervene in the proceeding as a formal party of record should file a petition under North Carolina Utilities Commission Rules R1-5 and R1-19 on or before Tuesday, October 31, 2023. Such petitions should be filed with the Chief Clerk of the North Carolina Utilities Commission, 4325 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, North Carolina 27699-4300. The direct testimony and exhibits of expert witnesses to be presented by intervenors should also be filed with the Commission on or before Tuesday, October 31, 2023.
