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## PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN FINLEY: The Commission -- let the record reflect that the Commission has convened tonight. It is 7:00 on July 7, 2015. We are convened in Docket Number W-354, Sub 344, which is an Application by Carolina Water Service, Inc., of North Carolina for a General Increase in Its Rates and Services. The purpose of this hearing has been scheduled to take the testimony of the public witnesses. We've inquired of the Public Staff as to whether or not there are any public witnesses. The Public Staff has indicated that there --

MS. HOLT: (Interposing) Oh, she's raising her hand now. Okay.

CHAIRMAN FINLEY: Does she want to testify now?

MS. TATE: Yes, I would.

CHAIRMAN FINLEY: All right. Well, we'll strike that and we'll start all over again.

Good evening. Let's come to order and go on the record. My name is Edward S. Finley, Jr. With me this evening are Commissioners Bryan E. Beatty, ToNola D. Brown-Bland, Don M. Bailey, Jerry C. Dockham and James G. Patterson.

The Commission now calls for hearing at this time for the purpose of taking the non-expert public witness testimony in Docket Number W-354, Sub 344, In The Matter of Application of Carolina Water Service, Inc., of North Carolina, 2335 Sanders Road, Northbrook, Illinois, for Authority to Increase Rates for Water and Sewer Utility Service in All Service Areas in North Carolina.

On March 31, 2015, Carolina Water Service filed an Application with the Commission seeking authority to increase its rates for providing water and sewer utility service in all of its service areas in North Carolina.

On April 30, 2015, the Commission issued its Order Establishing General Rate Case and Suspending Rates. Pursuant to this Order, the Commission declared this proceeding to be a general rate case pursuant to G.S. 62-137 and suspended the proposed rates for 270 days pursuant to G.S. 62-134.

On May 11, 2015, Carolina Water Service filed its notice regarding its semi-annual WSIC/SSIC surcharge application. In its filing, the Company states that it does not intend to file an application for a semi-annual adjustment of the Company's

Commission-authorized WSIC/SSIC surcharge mechanism on August 1, 2015.

On May 13, 2015, Carolina Water filed a letter stating that given the timing of its general rate case filing, the evidentiary hearing would normally have been set at a date near the end of August or early September 2015; however, at Carolina Water Service's request, the evidentiary hearing date was extended approximately 30 days to October 5, 2015.

On May 15, 2015, Corolla Light Community Association, Inc., filed a Petition to Intervene in this matter which was granted by Commission Order May 19, 2015.

On May 22, 2015, the Commission issued its Order Scheduling Hearing and Requiring Customer Notice which, among other things, scheduled the Application for evidentiary hearing on October 5, 2015 and scheduled the public witness testimony hearing for this date, at this time and place.

On July 1, 2015, Carolina Water Service filed its ongoing three-year water service improvement charge and sewer system improvement charge plan.

Several customer Statements of Position have been filed.

Pursuant to the State Ethics Act, I remind all members of the Commission of their duty to avoid conflicts of interest and inquire whether any member of the Commission has a known conflict of interest with regard to the matters coming before the Commission this evening?

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(No response.)

There appear to be no conflicts, so we will proceed, and we'll ask the parties to identify themselves for purposes of the record.

Thank you, Chairman Finley. MS. SANFORD: I'm Jo Anne Sanford with Sanford Law Office representing Carolina Water Service. And, if I might, with me at the table tonight are out-going -out-gone, I guess, President, Carl Daniel, who's agreed to sit up here with us one last time, and the new state President, Matt Klein, and, of course, Vice-President Martin Lashua. We have a number of employees in the audience. They are here because we never know how many members of the public to expect and we wanted to have enough people here to handle any questions. So I'll ask them to raise their hands, if they would, and they are available for any customer assistance. Thank you.

                         And one of the things that

        concerns me is that about this time last year I
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received a notice that I was going to have a water and sewer rate. I pay -- I was paying about -- between \$50 and \$53, \$54 a month. That rate went up to \$78. A senior citizen on a fixed income, I have to struggle to pay these bills thinking that every month from now on it's going to be at least \$78. But then the next month I get a bill that says zero and it's because the Utilities Commission -- blah, blah, blah -- incorrect -- blah, blah, blah -- and my bill went down to about \$53, \$54 again; it's remained that way.

This year, I get a notice about the water and sewage improvement charge that just took effect. And so I responded by asking why this charge had been added, and I was not told what the increase would be but there was. And so I wrote again, and then I got important notice enclosed, and this one is dated May 26th, and it lists a number of subdivisions that are affected. To my understanding, when we get bills — customers get bills like this, what we look for is the listing of our specific subdivision. We want to see that name. If we don't see that

name, then we figure it doesn't apply to us. I looked high and low on this. Did I see Ashley Hills? No, I didn't. But being the person that I am, and being a professional reporter who's now retired, used to work for Des Moines Register in investigative reporting, I knew that there was going to be more to this. And so, if you can figure it out, not seeing Ashley Hills listed on here, I am still figuring that there's going to be an increase, and that's very disturbing to me because I'm not seeing the fruits of CWS's What I am unfortunately having to endure labors. is profit going to people other than us who live I'm not seeing an improved services whatsoever.

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At one point I inquired about what I could do about the smell of the water, which affects the sewer because the water goes out through the sewer lines, and I was told by a Utility's employer -- employee was run the water for five or 10 minutes and then it will clear up. To me, that makes absolutely no sense because all that is is a waste of water. I don't even use the minimum amount of gallons of water;

therefore, I would not even use the minimum of 1 2 the sewer charge because it's just me. 3 water my lawn with the hose, I don't do any of 4 those sorts of things so I cannot see why a sewer 5 charge is being proposed. I'm concerned because, in the future of Wake County and across North 6 7 Carolina, there are people who believe that North 8 Carolina, in order to progress, needs to get rid 9 of its poor people and one way to do that is to 10 keep raising the bills for essential utilities 11 that either we dry up and blow away or we move from where we are to someplace else. 12 I'm not real sure about the originator of this quote and 13 14 I'm probably paraphrasing but I think it might 15 have been Dr. W.E.B. Du Bois who said, the battle 16 for natural resources is going to be the battle 17 of the twentieth century. Not saying 18 twenty-first, saying twentieth because he lived 19 during that period and so that is very true in my 20 estimation. And CWS seems to be a leading component of doing exactly that and it's 21 22 increasing its profits and we are the ones made 23 to pay for it.

And I guess I'll close by saying

that when different food companies have been 1 shown to be in error by The Food and Drug 2 3 Administration, for example, it will remove high fructose sugar from its Miss Effie's chocolate 4 5 cookie snacks and by removing those it's suppose to make the health of those people who eat those 6 7 cookies better and, in turn, they turn around and 8 raise the prices. Now, the consumer has a choice 9 of whether to eat those cookies or going to a 10 more reasonable brand. We, who live and have our 11 bills for water and sewer through CWS, don't have 12 much of a choice. We have to pay that bill or 13 else we have to move or we have to just dry up 14 and die. And so that's all I have to say and I 15 thank you for listening. 16 Ms. Tate, did you file a letter? Oh, I've just been filing letters. Yes, I have 17 18 been filing letters. My first letter was filed 19 last year. 20 Well, related to this case? 21 Α This year, I filed a letter April 24th, State of North Carolina Utilities Commission. 22 23 Okay. Q 24 And I got a response from the State of North

Carolina promptly afterward, April 29th,
concerning the Docket, and they thanked me for my
letter -- the Attorney General's Office and -Now, was that letter related to the notice you
got stating that your rates would be increased
because of the water/sewer improvement charge?
I got that -- I wrote that as a result of that
but at the same time I inquired with some private
parties and they told me to expect some more
rates, you know, coming down the pipe.

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Commission, the Carolina Water Service,
Incorporated, of North Carolina, just sent me the enclosed letter saying that it has requested and received approval from the Utilities Commission to raise my water and my sewer services charges yet once again without the input of the public once again. This is not fair. The CWS has been trying to increase unfairly my and my neighbors rates every year and from time to time has successfully increased them without improving any service or cleaning the nasty, smelly, gray water, and the putrid smell coming from its Knightdale treatment center. I can't even drink

the water without gagging. Again, I implore you to reconsider this inhumane and unfair request from CWS that was done in secret so that the public would have no chance to make our concerns known. Please reconsider this unfair and untimely request and apparent approval.

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So that had already occurred at the time that I wrote my letter in response, and then I got the formal request. This is in -- in fact, it's from you I believe, and you go to a great deal of detail, and telling me about how these steps have occurred. And then at the end, based on the improvements made and verified, CWSNC was authorized by the Commission to impose a .81 percent SSIC charge on your total sewer utility bill. Based on our calculation, the average sewer bill will increase by \$0.36 a month -- well, that's my \$0.36 -- from \$44.71 to \$45.07 based on an average of 4750 gallons. you receive a flat rate service, your average monthly bill will increase by 36 months (sic) per month -- \$0.36 per month from \$44.70 to \$45.06. Since you do not receive water service from CWSNC -- although we still send both bills to the

water bill. Ms. Tate, I hope this gives you a better idea of why you received notice of an increase in your sewer rates. And that was dated June 3rd in response to my letter that was dated, not May 5th as somebody apparently told you, but as of my letter of April 24th. So there is still a sewer rate increase still headed down the pipe. And, for me, anything that's going to increase the price without a noticeable increase in services is not fair. Having your cookies and eating them, too, and charging an increased price.

- Q Now, you talked about discolored water; do you still have discolored water?
  - As of today -- I guess perhaps a month ago there were people from Utilities, Inc., that were flushing out the water from the hydrants. They said that they had installed new water tanks and that the water was going to be clear from there on. The water is clear in the toilet. The water sometimes is clear from the faucets, most of the time it is clear, but it still has a smell and I still don't drink it. I have not drunk water

1	from fau	cets for close to 10 years.
