If the idea of a 50+% increase in your monthly total water and sewer bill does not bother you, please do not read further.

If this does bother you, as it does us, please do.

Enclosed are:

- 1. A 4 page Notice to Customers from AQUA detailing their proposed cost increases you should have received via US Mail. We have highlighted the usage details that will apply to Willow Glen.
- 2. Two pages which are a chart showing the Present, Proposed and Increased costs proposed by AQUA to the NC Utilities Commission for implementation by January 23, 2023 (per a conversation Dennis had with AQUA). The second page can be used by you to determine, as close as possible, what your monthly, and hence annual cost increases will be.
- 3. Five pages of Examples of what monthly water and sewer charges will be at various usage levels. You can use these to help- you determine what your increases will be.

We easily calculated that our Water and Sewer costs (based on an average usage of 10,000 gallons per month from Sept 15, 2021 t0m Sept 15, 2022) will be:

Other points of Interest;

1. Reducing water usage will not reduce your costs proportionately since the Hook-Up costs (esp. for Sewer) are large compared to total costs. In the Example above the Hook-Up costs are \$1,051.80 (64.2 %) of the total coats of \$1635.80. Lower usage will result in a higher % of total costs being the Hook-Up costs.

2. If we do not strongly protest these huge increases they will no doubt be implemented. Just think what your reaction would be if Duke Energy proposed a 50+% rate increase or if New Hanover county increased your taxes that much.

(Applicant), 202 MacKenan Court, Cary, North Carolina 27511, has filed an application with the North Carolina Utilities Commission for authority to increase rates for providing water and/or sewer utility service in all its service areas in North Carolina and for approval of a Water and Sewer Investment Plan (WSIP). The Applicant's proposed changes to the present water and sewer rates for its Fairways and Beau Rivage (The Cape) service areas in New Hanover County are as follows:

The Sewer System Improvement Charge is applied to the total sewer utility bill of each customer under the Applicant's applicable rates and charges.

The Commission may consider additional or alternative rate design proposals that were not included in the original application and may order increases or decreases in the schedules that differ from those proposed by the Applicant. However, any rate structure considered will not generate more overall revenues than requested.

#### EFFECT OF RATES

The effect of the proposed rate increase will vary based on usage. The average monthly residential water bill, based on a three-year average usage of 6,500 gallons, would increase by approximately the percentages in the table below. The WSIP Year 1 increase includes the Proposed percentage increase, and the WSIP Year 1 through 3 increases are cumulative.

#### WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT CHARGE MECHANISM

Pursuant to Commission Rules R7-39(k) and R10-26(k), the Water System Improvement Charge and Sewer System Improvement Charge shall be reset at zero as of the effective date of new base rates established by the Commission in this general rate case. If the Company's request for approval of a WSIP is granted, the WSIC and SSIC will be discontinued during the term of the WSIP pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.1B and Commission Rule R1-17A, If the WSIP is not approved, the Company plans to immediately continue use of the WSIC and SSIC.

#### CONSUMPTION ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM

Aqua has requested authority to implement a "Consumption Adjustment Mechanism" (CAM) within each of the Company's three water rate divisions, pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.12A and Commission Rules R7-40 and R10-27 if the WSIP is not authorized.<sup>1</sup>. Aqua asserts that the mechanism, if approved for use, is intended to provide a true-up of the average per-customer consumption levels used to calculate rates necessary to achieve an approved revenue requirement.

#### RATES UNDER BOND

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-134, Aqua has requested a final order be issued within six months from July 30, 2022, the proposed effective date of new rates. Otherwise, pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-135, Aqua intends to implement

its proposed rates under bond on a temporary, interim basis subject to refund, effective for service rendered on and after six months from July 30, 2022, or January 30, 2023.

#### WATER AND SEWER INVESTMENT PLAN (WSIP)

This filing also includes a request for approval of a WSIP pursuant to G.S. 62-133.1B and Commission Rule R1-17A. This rate-making mechanism will allow the Company to recover the reasonably known and measurable capital investments and anticipated reasonable and prudent expenses approved under the WSIP. In support of this request, the Company has filed a three-year plan with its application which lists proposed water and sewer capital investment projects, anticipated water and sewer expenses, and the proposed rates to be effective in each year of the WSIP. By law, any rate adjustment allowed under an approved WSIP shall not, on an annual basis for years two and three of the WSIP, exceed five percent of the utility's North Carolina retail jurisdictional gross revenues for the preceding plan year. The Commission may, however, consider the addition of certain unplanned emergency capital investments even if such expenditures would cause the cap to be exceeded. The Commission may also terminate or modify any WSIP approved in this case if it determines that termination or modification is in the public interest.

In this WSIP, the Company has requested that the Commission allow it to recover water service revenues for the Fairways water rate division of \$2,261,882 in year one, \$2,377,333 in year two, and \$2,492,967 in year three. If the WSIP is approved without modifications, the average monthly-water bill for a typical residential Fairways water customer. (based upon monthly water usage of 6,530 gallons) would be \$30.99 in year one, \$31.89 in year two, and \$32.75 in year three.

In this WSIP, the Company has requested that the Commission allow it to recover sewer service revenues for the Fairways sewer rate division of \$3,775,477 in year one, \$3,819,361 in year two, and \$3,946,569 in year three. If the WSIP is approved without modifications, the average monthly sewer bill for a typical residential Fairways sewer customer (based upon monthly sewer usage of 6,500 gallons) would be \$96.09 in year one, \$95.56 in year two, and \$97.09 in year three.

The hearings will resume in Raleigh on January 9, 2023, at 2:00 p.m., solely for the purpose of receiving expert witness testimony from the parties' witnesses and will continue as required for testimony and cross-examination of expert witnesses for the Company, the Public Staff, and other intervenors.

Consumer statements may be submitted to the Commission via the web form at https://www.ncuc.net/contactus.html. Consumer statements are not evidence unless those persons appear at a public witness hearing and testify concerning the information contained in their consumer statements.

Pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 14-269.4, absent certain specific exceptions, it is unlawful for any person to possess, or carry, whether openly or concealed, any deadly weapon, not used solely for instructional or officially sanctioned ceremonial purposes, in any building housing any court of the General Court of Justice.
