On February 25, 2020, DEC filed direct testimony and exhibits in support of its application for CPRE Program cost recovery and 2019 CPRE Program compliance report. By its application, DEC requests Commission approval for the establishment of charges to recover DEC's CPRE Program-related costs effective for service rendered on and after September 1, 2020. DEC's request, including the regulatory fee, would result in increases of 0.0173 cents per kilowatt-hour (kWh) for residential customers, 0.0161 cents per kWh for general service and lighting customers, and 0.0152 cents per kWh for industrial customers. If approved, the net effect of DEC's request would be to increase the monthly bill of a residential customer using 1,000 kWh of electricity by \$ 0.17.
