To Whom It May Concern:


We are writing to **OPPOSE** the plan submitted to the North Carolina Utilities Commission to change the net metering rules for Duke Energy residential Customers. We have only heard about this plan through word of mouth and as an active solar residential customer find it hard to believe that we have received no correspondence from Duke directly what their intentions are.

We are concerned:

- That there has not been to our knowledge as required by NC House Bill 589 an investigation regarding the costs and benefits of rooftop solar prior to any changes to the net metering plan.
- The effect on North Carolina's climate goals if net metering is changed such that potential customers are discouraged. We have generally been pleased with the current costs associated with our current net metering plan compared to other plans that friends have who are served by another electric utility.
- That discouraging solar investment would cost North Carolina well paying jobs.
- That it is not fair for Duke to change our net metering plan retroactively.

Again, please reject this plan and **SAVE ROOFTOP SOLAR!**
