Thank you for your interest in this matter. The Utilities Commission will be considering issues related to electric utility customer requests to opt-out of automated metering infrastructure (AMI) meters, or smart meters, in the coming months. The Utilities Commission and Public Staff do not, however, manage which customers receive electric service through AMI meters. Until such time as an order is issued related to smart meter opt-out, you should contact your electric utility directly if you wish to be temporarily bypassed from having a smart meter installed.
