Dear NCUC, As you close public comment for Duke Energy's consolidated docket E-100 Sub 190, I urge you to put communities and the climate first. Communities living in the shadow of dirty power plants have already paid dearly for our reliance on energy sources that are not clean – suffering serious harms to their health, air, and water.
