BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On September 26, 2022, Carolina Water Service, Inc. of North Carolina (CWSNC) and Mountain Air Utilities Corporation (Mountain Air) filed with the Commission an Application for Transfer of Public Utility Franchise and for Approval of Rates (Application) seeking authority to transfer the water and wastewater utility systems and public utility franchise serving the Mountain Air Development in Yancey County, North Carolina, from Mountain Air to CWSNC and for approval of rates.

On June 30, 2023, North Carolina Session Law 2023-67, entitled "An Act to Expedite Transfer of Water or Wastewater Public Utilities" (the Act), was signed into law by Governor Roy Cooper, having been previously ratified by the North Carolina General Assembly. The Act provides timelines for the Commission's consideration of applications for grants or transfers of certificates of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) for certain water and wastewater systems.

Section 1.(b) of the Act applies to applications for the grant or transfer of CPCNs for water and wastewater systems currently pending before the Commission as of June 30, 2023. Among other things, this section requires the Commission to provide notice by July 31, 2023, whether any pending application is complete.

The Public Staff presented this matter at the Commission's Staff Conference on May 22, 2023, indicating that the Application was considered complete and requesting an order delineating procedural guidelines for the efficient resolution of the matter.

On June 5, 2023, the Commission determined the Application was complete and issued an Order Scheduling Hearings, Establishing Discovery Guidelines, and Requiring Customer Notice (Scheduling Order).

Based on the foregoing and the entire record in this proceeding, the Presiding Commissioner finds good cause to determine that the Application in this matter is complete and that all parties to this matter were provided notice of same with the issuance of the Scheduling Order on June 5, 2023.

IT IS, THEREFORE, SO ORDERED.
