P1. <u>DOCKET NO. E-2, SUB 1142 – DUKE ENERGY PROGRESS, LLC – REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF CORRECTED COMPLIANCE TARIFFS AND RECOVERY OF REVENUE DEFICIENCY</u>

EXPLANATION: On May 14, 2018, Duke Energy Progress, LLC (DEP), filed a request to (1) revise its tariffs, approved in the Company's rate case, to remove a rate decrement resulting from a fuel experience modification factor (EMF) that expired and was removed from billed rates on November 30, 2017, but was inadvertently included in the calculation of the compliance rates filed effective March 16, 2018, and (2) recover in the Company's next fuel proceeding the revenue deficiency of approximately \$15 million that has resulted since March 16, 2018, due to the rate calculation error.

In its request, DEP explained that its tariffs are constructed in a manner that includes all rider charges in the schedule rates. This provides customers a single source to identify all charges applicable to their monthly bill rather than needing to consult both the billing schedule and individual rider tariffs to identify all billing rates. This approach requires the revised base rates approved in the rate case to be adjusted for all rider adjustments occurring after the Company's rate case filing. The impact of these adjustments was previously provided as Compliance Exhibit No. 8. The Company has since discovered that while this exhibit properly identified all post-filing rider adjustments to schedule rates, it inadvertently included the fuel EMF approved in Docket No. E-2, Sub 1107, which expired on November 30, 2017.

DEP further explained that while the expired EMF decrement was included in the new general rate case rate schedules, the expiration of the fuel EMF was properly reflected in both the fuel charges billed to customers on and after December 1, 2017, and March 16, 2018. Therefore, the effect of the inadvertent error has been an undercollection of the non-fuel base revenues approved by the Commission in this proceeding.

With respect to the undercollection from March 16 through June 1, 2018, DEP is requesting approval to recover any undercollection without interest over the same time period as the fuel under/over-recovery in the Company's next fuel proceeding. DEP stated that this approach would minimize the impact on customer bills.

DEP included with its filing Corrected Compliance Tariffs with schedule energy rates that remove the expired, prior-year fuel EMF. The Company requested the corrected tariffs be made effective starting June 1, 2018. If the corrected tariffs are approved, DEP will notify customers by bill insert, stating that the impact of the rate changes on the typical 1000 kWh monthly residential bill would be an increase of \$6.82 instead of the previously noticed \$5.22.

The Public Staff has reviewed DEP's request and believes that it is a reasonable resolution of the error. The request does not change the revenue requirement approved by the Commission in the rate case and noticed to customers. It would correct what is essentially a clerical mistake in designing rates to achieve that revenue requirement. The Corrected Compliance Tariffs filed by DEP appear to be correctly calculated. DEP has calculated the deficiency amount without any interest or carrying costs being charged to customers.

Because this is correction of a calculation error and not a substantive change to any findings or conclusions from the rate case, the Public Staff is not opposed to DEP's request.

RECOMMENDATION: (Drooz/Floyd/Maness) That the Commission issue the Public Staff's proposed order approving DEP's request as filed.

E. WATER

P1. <u>DOCKET NO. W-354, SUB 360 – CAROLINA WATER SERVICE, INC. OF NORTH</u> CAROLINA – APPLICATION FOR A RATE INCREASE

EXPLANATION: On April 27, 2018, Carolina Water Service, Inc. of North Carolina (CWSNC or Applicant) filed an application with the Commission seeking authority to increase its rates for providing water and sewer utility service in all of its service areas in North Carolina, except the Corolla Light/Monteray Shores service area. The Applicant serves approximately 34,871 water customers, 21,531 sewer customers, and 5,087 availability accounts in 38 counties throughout the State. The present rates for water and sewer service in all of the Applicant's service areas have been in effect since November 8, 2017, pursuant to Commission Order in Docket No. W-354, Sub 356.

CWSNC is proposing to increase water and sewer rates for its four rate divisions approved in the last general rate case: CWSNC Uniform Water, CWSNC Uniform Sewer, Bradfield Farms/Fairfield Harbour/Treasure Cove Water, and Bradfield Farms/Fairfield Harbour Sewer.

The Applicant is also proposing uniform water and sewer rates for Elk River Development. The test year is the 12-month period ending December 31, 2017.

In addition, CWSNC is requesting authority to implement a "consumption band" water and wastewater rate adjustment mechanism within each of the Applicant's rate divisions. CWSNC contends that the proposed mechanism would balance the risk and impact on ratepayers and shareholders of levels of water and wastewater consumption that are either significantly higher or lower than those levels of consumption that were used to set the rates.

Based on the Applicant's proposed rate increase and its current average consumption for water and sewer in gallons¹, the average monthly residential bill for customers with meters less than 1 inch and the percentage increase under the proposed rates are as follows:

The Public Staff recommends that the matter be declared a general rate case, scheduled for hearings, and that customers be notified. Because CWSNC is not proposing to change rates for customers in its Corolla Light/Monteray Shores service area, the Public Staff recommends that the Applicant not be required to send a notice to those particular customers.

RECOMMENDATION: (Casselberry/Feasel/Holt) That the proposed order be issued establishing a general rate case, suspending rates, scheduling hearings and requiring customer notice.

P2. <u>DOCKET NO. W-1209, SUB 11 – JACTAW PROPERTIES LLC – APPLICATION</u> FOR AUTHORITY TO DISCONTINUE PUBLIC UTILITY SERVICE

EXPLANATION: On March 31, 2017, Jactaw Properties LLC (Applicant) filed an application for authority to discontinue water and sewer utility service in Poplar Acres Mobile Home Park in Buncombe County, North Carolina.

The Applicant purchases water from the City of Asheville and purchases sewer from Metropolitan Sewerage District and serves approximately 41 residential customers who also rent their mobile home from the Applicant. All tenants rent on a month to month basis.

The Applicant is seeking to cancel its franchise and include the cost of water and sewer service in the monthly rent. The Applicant would increase the rent by \$30.00. This would be accomplished by giving all the residents a 60 day notice informing them that the rent will increase by \$30.00, and would include water and sewer service. The increase in rent would be less than the current monthly bill, based on 2,000 gallons of consumption, as shown below:

On February 19, 2018, the Commission issued an Order Requiring Customer Notice, specifying that the matter may be decided without a public hearing if no significant protests were received subsequent to customer notice. The Certificate of Service was filed on April 25, 2018. The 45-day notice period has expired, and no protests have been received.

The Public Staff recommends that an order be issued canceling the franchise for providing water and sewer utility service in Poplar Acres Mobile Home Park in Buncombe County, North Carolina, effective on the date the Order is issued.

P3. <u>DOCKET NO. W-1311, SUB 1 – CBL & ASSOCIATES MANAGEMENT, INC. –</u> REQUEST FOR TARIFF REVISION

EXPLANATION: On October 6, 2017, CBL & Associates Management, Inc. (CBL or Applicant), filed a letter with the Commission requesting authority to amend its tariff for the purpose of passing along to its customers in Mayfaire Town Center and Mayfaire Community Center (Shopping Center) in New Hanover County, North Carolina, the increases in costs of purchasing water and sewer services from the Cape Fear Public Utility Authority (CFPUA). CFPUA's new rates went into effect July 1, 2017.

The Public Staff reviewed the application and determined that it was incomplete and that the Pass-Through Verification Form had not been filed.

On April 16, 2018, CBL amended its application, submitted a new master meter exhibit, and filed the Pass-Through Verification Form, completing its application.

CBL serves 93 commercial customers with submeters, and serves eight commercial customers with their own individual master meter. Customers with submeters are billed the approved monthly rate, which is calculated using the same methodology as an apartment reseller. The approved monthly rate includes a billing fee of \$3.25 per unit which is split between water and sewer. Customers with their own master meter are billed bimonthly the actual cost for purchased water and sewer from CFPUA.

The Public Staff has reviewed the Applicant's request and recommends that the Applicant be allowed to increase its rates as shown below. CBL agrees with the Public Staff's recommended rates.

The Public Staff presented this matter to the Commission at its Regular Staff Conference on May 21, 2018. The Public Staff stated that it had reviewed DEP's request and believes that the Company's proposal was a reasonable resolution of the error. The Public Staff further stated that the request does not change the revenue requirement approved by the Commission in the rate case and noticed to customers and that it would correct what is essentially a clerical mistake in designing rates to achieve that revenue requirement. The Public Staff concluded by stating that the Corrected Compliance Tariffs filed by DEP appeared to be correctly calculated, and that DEP has calculated the deficiency amount without any interest or carrying costs being charged to customers.

Based on the foregoing, the Commission is of the opinion that DEP's proposal to correct a clerical mistake in its March 16, 2018, compliance tariffs should be approved.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That the Corrected Compliance Tariffs filed May 14, 2018, should be approved for service effective June 1, 2018.
- 2. That the Company is hereby authorized to recover any undercollection of EMF resulting from this clerical mistake in its next fuel proceeding filed pursuant to Commission Rule R8-55.
- 3. That the Company shall provide customers with notice of the Corrected Compliance Tariffs, including a revised calculation of a residential bill consuming 1,000 kWh.
- 4. That the Company shall file within 5 days, the customer notice and a complete set of tariffs with an effective date of June 1, 2018.

BY THE COMMISSION: On October 6, 2017, CBL & Associates Management, Inc. (CBL or Applicant), filed a letter with the Commission requesting authority to amend its tariff for the purpose of passing along to its customers in Mayfaire Town Center and Mayfaire Community Center (Shopping Center) in New Hanover County, North Carolina, the increases in costs of purchasing water and sewer services from the Cape Fear Public Utility Authority (CFPUA). CFPUA's new rates went into effect July 1, 2017.

The Public Staff reviewed the application and determined that it was incomplete and that the Pass-Through Verification Form had not been filed.

On April 16, 2018, CBL amended its application, submitted a new master meter exhibit, and filed the Pass-Through Verification Form, completing its application.

CBL serves 93 commercial customers with submeters, and serves eight commercial customers with their own individual master meter. Customers with submeters are billed the approved monthly rate, which is calculated using the same methodology as an apartment reseller. The approved monthly rates includes a billing fee of \$3.25 per unit, which is split between water and sewer. Customers with their own master meter are billed bimonthly the actual cost for purchased water and sewer from CFPUA.

This matter was presented at the Commission's Regular Staff Conference on May 21, 2018. The Public Staff stated that it has reviewed the Applicant's request and

recommended that the Applicant be allowed to increase its rates as shown below. CBL agreed with the Public Staff's recommended rates.
