On August 11th, 2020, Piedmont filed a confidential Minimum Margin Agreement with the

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Charlotte Pipe and Foundry. Public Staff reviewed the
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    agreement and recommends allowing the agreement to
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    become effective subject to the conditions set out in
    the proposed Order. A company representative is here
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    to answer any questions the Commission may have.

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1	present an interconnection amendment and agreement
2	filed by Verizon South and Service Telephone Company
3	in August. The Public Staff has reviewed the filings
4	and recommends that orders be issued approving the
5	agreements and the amendment of the agreement and
6	amendment, I'm sorry, effective on the date they were
7	filed. The Public Staff has provided proposed Orders
8	to the Commission Staff.

MS. BHATTA: Good morning. My name is
Shashi Bhatta, Engineer, Public Staff Water, Sewer,
and Telephone Division. Item No. 4 Docket, W-4, Sub
23. Joyceton Water Works, Inc. filed an application
for authority to transfer its franchise for providing
water utility service in Caldwell County, to the City
of Lenoir, which is exempt from Commission
regulations. One customer has submitted a statement
in protest of future rate increases. However, that
does not qualify as significant protest requiring
public hearing.

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The Public Staff has reviewed the application and recommends that the Commission issue a proposed Order approving transfer to owner exempt from regulations, canceling franchise, and Requiring Customer Notice.

COMMISSIONER HUGHES: Second.

CHAIR MITCHELL: It's been moved and seconded that the item be approved as recommended by the Public Staff. I'll take a question from Commissioner McKissick.

COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: Just one quick

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question. I noticed in the proposed Order the Town of
Lenoir is picking up the water customers, but it
specifically points out that they're not purchasing, I
guess, the water tanks and the fire pump. So I assume
Lenoir has its own fire suppression systems and
hydrants, and things like that, so what's going to
become of that equipment that's still out there that
theoretically either needs to be taken down,
disassembled or I guess sits there as a relic?
becomes of the water tanks and the fire pump?
         MS. BHATTA: Okay. From my conversation
with the City of Lenoir personnel Public Utilities
Director, I think, what he said was the fire pumps and
the tanks are all non-portable.
                                They're on the
non-portable side, which some of the facilities may
require fire protection for insurance purposes, so
that's what was installed. And some items are not
even in use currently, and the waterlines within this
development is small size waterlines, two inch or
three inch, which do not have fire hydrants.
the City had said was that is the fire protection
system that's currently in use, if it is, is all
non-portable. The City's not going to take over any
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of that, but over time, they do plan to replace some

of the waterlines within there to make it large sizes and maybe install fire hydrants at that time. The City did not want those fire protection system because it's on the non-portable side, and they don't see a use for it, but the Joyceton -- if I can have our attorney kind of point out on the e-mail that we got was that they might find somebody to use the fire protection system as some private entity that's within this development maybe able to use it.

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MS. COXTON: Ms. Bhatta is correct. That's the information that we received. Just to reiterate, essentially, they tried to find a purchaser for the fire system and they weren't able to find anyone who was interested, so I think what they indicated is that once the transfer actually goes through to the City of Lenoir, they will make a decision about what they would like to do with the extra fire system infrastructure.

COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: So I raise the question I take it based upon the type of fire system that it is, it's more likely the voluntary fire company would be, I guess, using it more so than anybody else. Is that a reasonable assumption to make?

MS. BHATTA: Well sometimes, the service connections may need additional sprinkler systems within their building. So if there's a facility like that that could use it for personal use, they could sell it to somebody like that.

commissioner McKissick: Well, it was just something that appeared to me that it was being -- kind of an oversight that nobody was doing anything with it because it looked like this water company basically was -- for all practical purposes, it only had 100 customers or so basically, I assumed, going out of business, I want to say, of other facilities in that area that I'm unaware of. Do they have any other customers in that area?

MS. COXTON: No, sir. This was --

COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: I didn't think so. So this is it.

MS. COXTON: Yes.

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COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: I support the item but I would suggest that you guys go back and find out what they're going to do with it. I mean, it shouldn't just sit there as a relic. I mean, something needs to become of it. Even if they donate it to something like a voluntary fire company that

1	might access it if they have a voluntary fire company
2	in the area rather than just sit there unattended to
3	and rusting away.
4	MS. BHATTA: Yeah. Yeah.
5	COMMISSIONER McKISSICK: Thank you.
