BY THE CHAIRMAN: On June 18, 2009, the Commission issued an Order in this docket which scheduled a hearing to consider the Agreement and Joint Stipulation of Settlement (Agreement) filed by certain Stipulating Parties. The Stipulating Parties include Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC, the Public Staff, and a group which identified itself as the "Environmental Intervenors." The hearing was scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, August 12, 2009.

On June 30, 2009, the Environmental Intervenors filed a motion requesting that the hearing in this docket be rescheduled and that an extension of time be granted for filing intervenor and rebuttal testimony. In support of their motion, the Environmental Intervenors stated that their sole witness has a conflicting obligation on August 12-14, 2009, and that no parties object to rescheduling the hearing.

The Chairman finds good cause to reschedule the hearing and grant the requested extensions of time for filing intervenor and rebuttal testimony as requested.

## IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

- 1. That the hearing in this docket is hereby rescheduled to begin at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, August 19, 2009, to consider the Agreement filed by the Stipulating Parties. The hearing shall be held in Commission Hearing Room 2115, Dobbs Building, 430 North Salisbury Street, Raleigh, North Carolina.
- 2. That the testimony of non-stipulating Intervenors shall be filed not later than Monday, July 27, 2009.
- 3. That the Stipulating Parties shall file rebuttal testimony not later than Monday, August 10, 2009. Duke may also file rebuttal testimony that same day on the issue of the appropriate jurisdictional allocation method and issues related to the Modified IRR analyses.
