NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on February 27, 2015, Overman Solar, LLC (Applicant), filed an application, as amended on December 20, 2018, seeking a certificate of public convenience and necessity pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 62-110.1(a) for construction of a 5-MW solar generating facility to be located on 191 Herring Road, Goldsboro, Wayne County, North Carolina. The Applicant plans to sell the electricity to Duke Energy Progress, LLC.

If no complaint is received within the time specified above and if the Commission does not order a hearing upon its own initiative, the Commission will enter an order awarding the certificate sought by the Applicant.
