BY THE PRESIDING COMMISSIONER: On February 8, 2010, the Southern Environmental Law Center (SELC) filed a petition to intervene in the Sub 124 docket. The petition states that SELC and its members have a direct and substantial interest in the electric utility Integrated Resource Planning process in North Carolina.

Also on February 8, 2010, SELC filed a motion for an extension of time until February 19, 2010, for intervenors to file direct testimony and for an extension of time until March 9, 2010, for rebuttal testimony in this proceeding. SELC states that no party objects to the requested extensions of time and that the extensions will not require any change in the evidentiary hearing date.

The Presiding Commissioner is of the opinion that good cause exists to allow the intervention by SELC and to allow the requested extensions of time.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED as follows:

1. That SELC shall be, and hereby is, allowed to intervene in the Sub 124 docket;
2. That the name and address of the attorney for SELC is as follows:


