

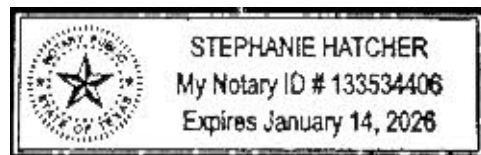

Stat. § 62-133.2 and Commission Rule 70-80 for the purpose of determining whether an increase or decrease rider is required to reflect changes in fuel and fuel-related costs over or under the base fuel rate established for DEC in its last general rate case.

On February 27, 2024, DEC filed its application in the above-captioned docket. By its application, DEC requests Commission approval for an increase in its fuel and fuel-related costs currently in effect, with the changes being effective for services rendered on and after September 1, 2024. If approved by the Commission, DEC's proposed changes in fuel rates would result in an increase of the current fuel rates of all customer classes with the amount of the increase varying by different customer classes effective September 1, 2024, followed by a decrease beginning on January 1, 2025. More particularly, for the four-month period beginning September 1, 2024, and ending December 31, 2024, a typical residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month would experience an increase of \$1.80, or 1.1%. The impacts for average general services/lighting customers and industrial customers vary by customer, but are approximately increases of 3.8% and 0.1%, respectively. Beginning on January 1, 2025, customer bills are expected to decrease. A typical residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month would experience a decrease of \$12.08, or 3.8% from fuel factors currently in effect. The impacts for average general services/lighting customers and industrial customers vary by customer, but are approximate decreases of 12.6% and 13.8%, respectively from fuel factors currently in effect.
