Re: Joint Electric Power Suppliers' Motion for a 1-Year Delay of Their Swine and Poultry Waste-to-Energy Set-Aside Compliance Obligations
(Docket No. E-100, Sub 113)

Honorable Clerk and Commissioners:

I serve as counsel and policy director for the North Carolina Sustainable Energy Association ("NCSEA"), an intervenor in this docket. NCSEA files this letter in lieu of a proposed order or post-hearing brief.

NCSEA supports the perspectives and positions contained in the post-hearing briefs filed by the North Carolina Poultry Federation ("Poultry Federation") and the North Carolina Pork Council. Specifically, NCSEA supports Argument Nos. 4 and 5 in the Poultry Federation's Post-Hearing Brief (with extension of the arguments to cover both subsections (e) and (f) of N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.8):

No. 4: *The NC Poultry Federation Requests that the Commission Make a Specific Finding and Conclusions in its Order Relating to the Public Interest Served Through the Compliance With N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.8(f).*

No. 5: *The North Carolina Poultry Federation Requests That the Commission Include in its Order a Requirement that All Electric Suppliers Subject to N.C. Gen. Stat. § 62-133.8(f) Should Submit Tri-annual Reports in Order to Give the Commission and the Parties an Opportunity to Review Detailed Information Throughout the Year on Efforts of the Electric Power Suppliers to Meet the Requirements of the Statute.*
